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Various approaches with ACE for ASEAN+3 OSRM activities

➤ **2008FY ~2010FY**

- JOGMEC, as co-secretariat of ACE, worked for ASEAN+3 OSRM WG initiative.

➤ **2010FY~**

- Continuously hold annual OSRM WS to follow up the OSRM initiative

➤ **2014FY**

- ACE and JOGMEC visited 6 AMSs to discuss on the data related to stockpiling to seek out any further needs.

➤ **2014FY ~**

- “Needs Research” requested by AMS on oil stockpiling for such as setting up legal framework.

➤ **2015FY ~**

- Energy Security for ASEAN Director General and Director Oil Capacity Building Program respectively.

Based on AMS’s various needs, METI/JOGMEC started this program as a joint study style since 2014FY.

➤ **Scheme**

Step 1. Arrangement between requesting country and Japan

Step 2. Set up i.e., “A scope of work” for the “Needs Research”

Step 3. Implementation of a study with requesting country for
necessity duration

Step 4. Conclude the Research

➤ **For Cambodia:** On stockpile policy options in 2014FY and on legal framework in 2015FY.

➤ **For Indonesia:** Ongoing since 2016FY.

➤ 2016FY

Indonesia delegate visited to Japan to share Japan’s experience on stockpile and made site visits to Tomakomai-tobu national oil stockpile sites, Idemitsu refinery in Hokkaido, Kushikino national oil stockpile and JX Nippon Oil & Energy Kiire Terminal in Kyushu.

➤ 2017FY

- June: Meeting to discuss the TOR (Time of Reference) for the research in Jakarta
- Oct: Workshop in Jakarta, organized for the government and industry participants from Indonesia to share Japan’s experience.



➤ **Outlines**

- In July 2010, the Narrative Report of OSRM for ASEAN+3 noted “The +3 Member Countries are expected to support in terms knowledge transfer, expertise, training workshops and other assistance which they could provide”.
- In 2012, the Result of Questionnaires for Country needs on ASEAN+3 as the input for training/workshop by ACE and JOGMEC.
- ACE Informed SOE leaders of the program implementation.
- In 2015FY, JOGMEC, in association with METI and ACE, started “Capacity Building” program for AMS.

➤ **Total participants in 2015FY-2017FY**

- **37 officials from AMS and ASCOPE in 5 programs**

➤ Directors, 4-Day program

- Date: 7-10, August 2017
- Venue: JOGMEC HQ (Tokyo) and Mutsu-Ogawara and Kuji national oil stockpile sites
- Participants: 7 officials from Cambodia, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippine, Singapore, Thailand and Viet Nam.
- Contents: IEA emergency response policy and outreach activities, OSRM development by ACE, Joint oil data initiative by APERC, Japan’s oil security policy by METI, Recent situation of national oil stockpiling base in Japan by JOGMEC, Oil stockpiling from the perspective of private sectors by industry experts, wrap up by all participants.



➤ Director Generals, 2-Day program

- Date: 6-7, March 2018
- Venue: JOGMEC Kyushu office (Fukuoka) and Shirashima national oil stockpile site.
- Participants: 7 officials from Indonesia, Malaysia, Cambodia, Thailand (two officials), Viet Nam and ASCOPE.
- Contents: IEA emergency response policy, Japan’s oil security policy by METI, JOGMEC’s experience with petroleum stockpiling for energy security, Discussion about OSRM development by all officials, ACE and ASOPE, wrap up by all participants.



➤ **The 14th ASEAN+3 Ministers on Energy Meeting, 28 September 2017, Manila, Philippine**



➤ **The Joint Ministerial Statement noted as below**

“The Ministers noted the progress and priorities of the 5th ASEAN+3 OSRM Workshop held on 24 May 2017 in Manila, the Philippines hosted by the Department of Energy (DOE) and jointly organized by JOGMEC and ACE. The Ministers also noted the Energy Security on Oil Capacity Building Program 2017 for Director Level for ASEAN held on 7-10 August 2017 in Tokyo, Japan. The participants exchanged information and discussed current issues and the directions of future cooperation, amongst others, on oil supply resiliency in ASEAN and Japan’s petroleum policies and emergency response measures. The Ministers further noted the JOGMEC’s initiative to conduct needs research activities for the development of oil stockpiling as bilateral support for policy making in the ASEAN Member States (AMS)”.

- JOGMEC will continue to cooperate works with AMS in the fields of oil stockpiling under ASEAN+3 OSRM WS as co-secretariat with ACE.
- In 2018FY, JOGMEC will conduct the following two pillar programs in association with METI, ACE and relevant organizations.
 1. Oil Capacity Building Programs on Energy Security

 2. Needs Research program on oil stockpiling
 - A joint study with Indonesia will be conducted based on the TOR.
